



On Friday, October 18, please join ASCS for a fun fall evening at Three Cedars Farm!



# Classroom Happenings



Sixth grade students in Mrs. Werner's science classes made conceptual models of the phases of the moon. Students planned their models using various media and then evaluated the strengths and weaknesses of their models.



Mrs. Werner's 5th grade science classes worked in small groups to figure out various items that were hidden in boxes. Based on mass, volume, the use of magnets, and other investigative tools, the students used inference to analyze objects they could neither see nor touch. After discussing ideas among group members, everyone anxiously participated in the big reveal to see how accurate their forecasts were. And what surprises were in the boxes? A penny, a ping-pong ball, a toy vehicle, a magnet, and an eraser. This example of using inference in science is a building block for the students' introduction to the properties of matter.
