## **March's Virtue - *Respect***

“All people are created in the image and likeness of God, with a soul that is able to love and to live forever in heaven. Every single human person has great dignity and deserves our respect. To “re-spect” means to “look again,” since many times we only see what people are like on the outside. This month’s virtue reminds us to look deeper and recognize that all of us are children of God and are loved by Him.

“When we look at people from this perspective, we can't help but respect them. When we see the very poorest, the weakest, or those who think they have no worth, we know that God treasures them individually, and that we are called to meet one another again in heaven. We cannot degrade, harm, manipulate, or take any human life for granted. Instead, the Gospel calls us to have deep respect for all people, including people of different ages, cultures, ideas, and abilities. (*Virtues in Practice, 2013*)”

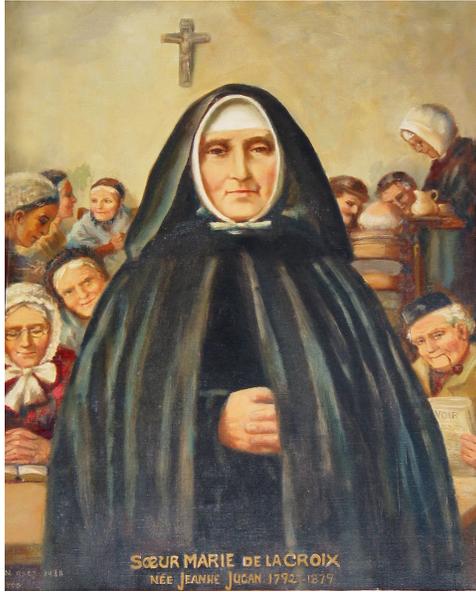

Prayer: *Act of Charity*/Come Holy Spirit, open our minds and our hearts to God's living Word!

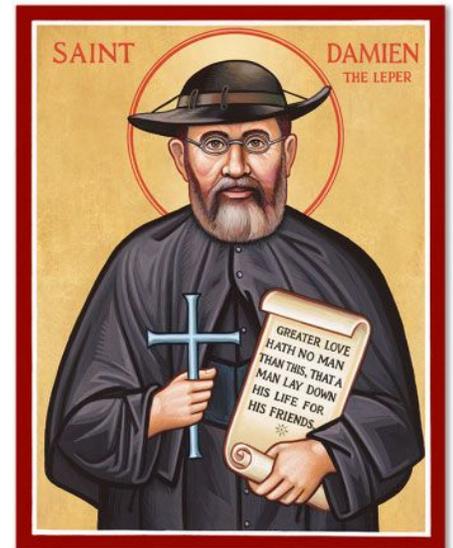
What is *Respect*? *Recognizing the dignity of all people*

Saint: *Saint Damien of Molokai (Feast Day: May 10)*

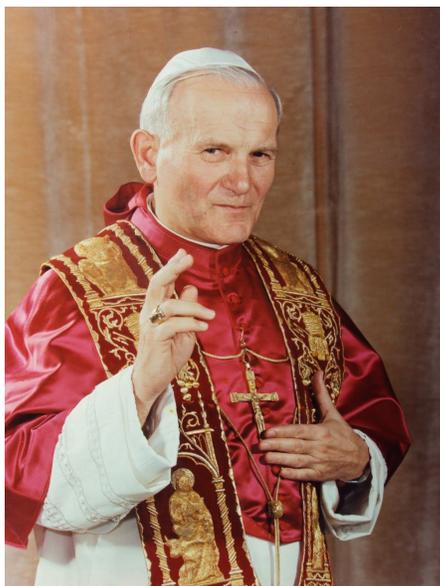
Question to ponder: What is respect? Who was Saint Damien of Molokai?

## Monthly Home Project Suggestions - Respect

All: Hang up a copy of the *Act of Charity* on the refrigerator. Pray the *Act of Charity* together as a family. (See following page for a large-print copy.)

Pre K-2nd Grade: Ask your Mom or Dad to teach you about a different culture, and what they like about it. Research a new recipe from another culture and prepare a meal together as a family.

3rd-5th Grade: Sometimes we tease and joke around with our friends to show affection and other times we tease in a way that has a mean edge to it. This month be careful about "teasing." If a person isn't your friend, and you "tease" them, it is probably mean, so stop it this month. Or, if you only tease with your friends, take a private moment to ask one of your friends if the way you tease hurts his or her feelings. If they say yes, ask forgiveness.

6th-8th Grade: The popularity game is often a cruel one that disrespects others. Be honest and make an examination of conscience. Do you respect others less if they don't dress, talk, eat, play etc. in the way you think is "right"? Who decides what way is "right" when it comes to preferences and styles? From your examination, come up with goals to help you grow this month in respect for the dignity of every person.
